



In Shared Reading, the teacher demonstrates how to read aloud properly. Teacher and children will then read aloud together in multiple subsequent readings. The teacher will also select teaching points based on the children's needs.

After Shared Reading, the children will enter their groups to complete tasks and activities that would reinforce their learning. Each group will be instructed by a member of our PLPR teaching team. The tasks and activities are scaffolded according to the children's learning abilities.




